# History of the Fourth Degree in Texas

The Patriotic Degree was established in the State of Texas on May 31, 1906. The celebrant of the Exemplification Mass was Father J. M. Kirwin, better remembered as Msgr. Kirwin, Vicar General of the Diocese of Galveston. In those days admittance to the Fourth Degree was by invitation only. A Brother Knight had to be asked and proposed for membership by a Fourth Degree member. The candidate was required to have a communion certificate signed by the pastor of his church certifying that he had received communion within the past two weeks and was a practical Catholic in all aspects as understood by the Holy See. These restrictions have been relaxed since Vatican II in the early sixties.



## Fourth Degree Organization

The membership of the Fourth Degree within the Order is divided into Provinces, Districts, and Assemblies. "Our Lady of Guadalupe Province" consists of the entire State of Texas and Oklahoma. Each Province is led by a Vice-Supreme Master of the Fourth Degree. The Vice-Supreme Master is always a Past State Deputy appointed by the Supreme Board of Directors to serve for a minimum four year term. The present Vice-Supreme Master of Our Lady of Guadalupe Province is Sir Knight Paul Weigl, Jr., Past State Deputy of Oklahoma. The state of Texas is further divided into six (6) different districts with the State of Oklahoma being one (1) District by itself. Each District is led by a District Master appointed by the Supreme Master to serve a minimum of two years. Sir Knights from the Galveston-Houston Archdiocese are members of the First District of Texas. The present Master of the First District of Texas is Sir Knight Peter Tan of Houston. The First District of Texas is comprised of 26 Assemblies. These Assemblies range from El Campo on the southwest to Orange on the east and from Galveston on the south to Lufkin on the north.

The First District of Texas has a total membership of over 2500 Sir Knights. The Monsignor George A. Wilhelm Assembly is one of the oldest and largest Assembly in the First District of Texas with a membership of over 450 Sir Knights, some 33 of which are clergy and dates back to 1911. The Msgr. Wilhelm Assembly is comprised of 15 councils and they range from Mid-Town and the Inner-City to the East, South and West within the Metro-Houston area, and one of those assigned councils is our very own, **Council 2917**.
